The Fulton County Museum in Gloversville will also offer a re-telling of Washington Irving's "**The Legend of Sleepy Hollow**" on Friday October 8th at 6:30 p.m. Join performer and artist Ragliacci for this exciting classic. Washington Irving's sister, Sarah Ann Irving and her husband Brigadier General Richard Dodge, veteran of the American Revolution and the War of 1812, are buried in the Colonial Cemetery on Green Street in Johnstown. Johnstown Historical Society is offering **Night Time Colonial Cemetery Tours** on Wednesday nights in October beginning the 13th. Find out about some of the notable residents of the cemetery, including tales of murder and grave robbing. As you might expect, the tour is not suitable for children under 6. Guides will take you into the cemetery with flashlights and lanterns, and you will need to bring your own flashlight to avoid broken headstones and tree roots. Tours are \$5, with the proceeds to support the Historical Society in the maintenance of 3 historic properties: the Drumm House, The Museum, And James Burk's Inn.
