The Greater Galway Community Basket Project, now in its 40th year, continues the purpose of providing a brighter holiday season for both children and adults in local families who qualify for assistance, In December of 2020, holiday baskets that helped 123 children, 191 adults, and 21 elderly persons.

The last two years the challenges presented by the continuing COVID-19 pandemic have increased need. Children home from school due to quarantines miss meals they usually receive at school. People struggling to put food on the table include single parents, the elderly, handicapped, and working poor.

As last year, concerns to limit exposure of both volunteers and recipients, many at high-risk, gift cards will be the primary way of providing groceries from local stores, and will enable parents to shop for their children. Those unable to shop for themselves will still be provided with baskets. Gifts for children will probably be a combination of physical gifts and gift cards. Because of the gift card-based program, monetary donations will be greatly appreciated. Food donations will also be used to fill baskets.
