In the past month: Arlene Rhodes, Co-Chair of the Archives, has donated several collections.

- 1. An interesting copy of a Petition circa. 1790, from Karen Wiesner, listing several Galway residents who wanted to obtain land in Canada. Some family names include: Michael Dowling (Dowland (alternate spelling)) and Hannah Dixon.
- 2. The continued accessioning of the rather large Parkis Mills ephemera collection. Included are: before and after photos of the demolition of the building, which the Fire Department deemed a safety hazard, April 19, 1980; and a wonderful photo of Edward Parkis working on a bedstone, c. 1880-1900. (Note: A bedstone is one of the grinding stones.).
